

Summer Reading Assignments by Grade Level

- 9th: *Animal Farm* by George Orwell
Interdisciplinary unit with Social Studies
Task: **Text-mark (i.e., write notes in the margins of)** your book as you read, looking for characters who display IB Learner Profile traits. Then make a digital copy of this form and fill out all 10 rows.

- 10th Grade: *Kindred* by Octavia Butler
Click here to view the Summer Reading Assignment! It will also be posted on Schoology. As you read *Kindred* this summer, your main goal is comprehending the text as a whole. You will use a graphic organizer to track the setting, characters, plot, and a motif. This will be a Summative Portfolio element that needs to be individually completed.

*Note: There is a TV show of *Kindred* that is *very loosely* based on the book. Watching instead of reading will not work out well for you.

- 11th Grade: *A Doll's House* by Henrik Ibsen

Read Ibsen's play for the following:

- **Plot:** Recall and explain the plot of the 3 acts of *A Doll's House*
- **Characters:** Identify and describe the 5 most significant characters in the play
- **Issues:** Give details about major issues and ideas in the text
- **Authorial Choices:** Explain how important symbols, motifs, stage directions, and other authorial choices contribute to the major issues and ideas

You have the following 4 options to demonstrate your understanding of these elements by creating **one of the following products**:

- Option #1: Text Annotation
- Option #2: Sketchnotes
- Option #3: Directing a Scene
- Option #4: Create a Comic Book of the play

- 12th Grade: The Anthropocene Reviewed: Essays
5 Journal entries about five essays of your choice.
Journal entries will address the following:
 - Overview of essay
 - Favorite line/passage/authorial
 - Consider the topic Green writes about and connect it to one of the Common App prompts. Then, brainstorm an essay topic you could write about yourself that also aligns with this common app prompt.
